## 2026 ICBC Scholarship Competition Application

Sponsored by Colorado's Independent Community Banks and  
Independent Community Bankers of Colorado

The Independent Community Bankers of Colorado (ICBC) will award five (5) \$1,750, one-time scholarships, to be applied towards the cost of tuition, fees, or books at a public or private university, college, junior or community college, or vocation/trade school. Awardees will be announced April 24, 2026. Scholarship proceeds will be paid directly to the school following enrollment and after classes have begun. This is a statewide scholarship contest.

### Eligibility

In order to be eligible, you must: be a full-time high school senior, have applied to, and will attend a public or private university, college, junior/community college, or vocation/trade school after high school graduation. *Due to the far reaching possible ramifications of Amendment 41, Ethics in Government, that amended Colorado's Constitution, if you or your parent(s)/guardian(s) work for a city, state or county office, you may not be eligible for this scholarship contest. Before applying, please consult with your trusted advisor on this issue.*

### Requirements

- Cumulative 3.0 GPA.
- You must attend a university, college, junior/community college, or vocation/trade school after high school graduation.
- You and/or your parent(s)/guardian(s) have a banking relationship at an **ICBC member bank or branch** for at least six months. To find out if your bank is an ICBC member call 720-607-7937 or visit <https://icbc Colo.org/scholarship> for a list.
  - **Please note the following financial institutions are *NOT* members of ICBC: Credit unions, Wells Fargo, Chase, Bank of America, CitiBank, Community Banks of Colorado, ANB Bank, PNC/FirstBank, KeyBank, USBank, and Vectra.**
- Complete application - must be typed and **signed by a bank representative**.
- You must complete the essay question.
- **Deadline for submission to your bank is Friday, March 27, 2026.**

### Selection of Scholarship Recipients

The ICBC's independent scholarship committee reviews received applications and selects five \$1,750 scholarship recipients. Recipients will be announced April 24, 2026. Scholarships are *not* based on financial need but on the quality of the application, references, and essay response. Awards will be presented at ICBC's Annual Convention on Thursday, September 17, 2026, at The Hythe, Vail.

### Along with the completed application, you must also submit:

1. **Three** (3) letters of recommendation, at least one must be from a school counselor or teacher and one personal reference.
2. Verification of acceptance to a public or private university, college, junior/community college, or vocation/trade school.
3. You may include your ACT and/or SAT scores with your application. (Not a requirement)

- \_\_\_\_\_ 7. Return pages of application in correct order and do **NOT** copy/print double-sided.
- \_\_\_\_\_ 8. Please paper clip your application. Do **NOT** staple or place in a binder.
- \_\_\_\_\_ 9. Return completed package to your bank on or before **Friday, March 27, 2026.**

Select a recent article from your ***local*** news source and write an essay of about 500 words (double-spaced, 12-point font) explaining how the issue in the article could affect your community's economy. In your essay, clearly describe the main issue or event, possible economic effects on local jobs, government services or household finances, and whether these effects are beneficial or harmful overall, and why you think so. Support your points with specific examples from the article.

**ESSAY GRADING CRITERIA**

Essays will be graded using these five criteria: 1. **Comprehension**: Does the essay reflect a thorough understanding of the economic issues of the topic? 2. **Organization**: Does the essay follow in a logical and easily understood progression? Does the corroborating evidence support the essay's main points? 3. **Conclusions**: Do the conclusions follow logically from the argument? Are the conclusions compelling? 4. **Creativity**: Were diverse resources and ideas used to develop the main points? 5. **Writing Style**: Was concise language and correct grammar, spelling, and punctuation used?
